SETTING

Present day Chicago.

The not so quiet spaces of corporate life, complete with cubicles, open floor plans, and closed minds.

WRITER'S NOTE

I started writing this play more than ten years ago, specifically with MPAACT, my artistic home since I was 18 years old, in mind. It was a story I knew I wanted to tell in the space where bold, transformative Black theater lives. But as life unfolded, so did the journey of this play. Grad school brought opportunities to further develop it, which led me away from its original home.

The Promotion finally had its debut (or sorts) in March 2020 - only to be cut short by the pandemic after just a few performances. A reimagined version ran in 2021, but something still felt unfinished.

Now, I'm thrilled to bring this play back to where it all began, to MPAACT, in the form it was always meant to take. This version represents a full-circle moment for me: what started here is now, finally, completed here.

At its heart, this play explores themes of ambition, identity, and the quiet negotiations we all make in spaces where power and vulnerability collide. It invites conversations about how we balance professional aspirations with personal responsibilities and the way privilege shapes opportunities - or the lack thereof.

Thank you for being part of this journey. I hope this work sparks meaningful dialogue and leaves you reflecting on the worlds we navigate every day and how each of us can show up in that world fully, as colleagues and friends.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I met Joseph Giovannetti at MPAACT as we were both beginning our careers as professional artists. Fresh from college theater programs we both found ourselves at a small storefront theater, run by old-school Black activists, determined to premiere a diversity of Black narratives.

This was a challenge from day one - finding our voices as the two distinctly non-Black artists, in a "Black first" creative collective. It has been the most privileged undertaking of my adult life. In these spaces, I have honed my craft, found fellowship, and with time, I have developed a keen eye for staging the complex narratives at which MPAACT excels - narratives grounded in the many cultures of Black people.

The Promotion was dropped into my lap just as Joe was navigating a new world of possibilities beyond MPAACT. He turned to me because he wanted a partner (in the director's chair) who understood his theater vocabulary - developed in large part with MPAACT. It also helped that I understood his sly wit, a hallmark of his work.

The Promotion is so very Joe and so very MPAACT at the same time. It is my honor to collaborate with Joe once again. We have both grown tremendously since we worked on this show for it's first public reading (at Steep Theater) almost a decade ago. Thank you for being here for our premiere - finally giving *The Promotion* the launch it so richly deserves.

Ariya Hawkins (Trish) is a Chicago-based actor, singer, and educator. She is a graduate of Millikin Univ. with a B.F.A in musical theatre, and a proud alumna of The Chicago H.S. for the Arts (ChiArts). Recent regional credits include Cabaret (Studio Theatre at Tierra Del Sol), Haven (Outer Loop), A Hit Dog Will Holler (Artemisia), Shut Up Kiss Me (PrideArts), and The Bikinis, The Queen Bees, and Vanities: The Musical (Canterbury Summer Theatre). Touring credits in-

clude A Raisin in the Sun and A Midsummer Night's Dream (Olney Theatre Center, National Players Tour 72), as well as Imagine That!, a Theatre for the Very Young (TVY) performance that toured across Chicago Public Libraries through a partnership with Northwestern Univ. When not performing, Ariya serves Chicago communities as a teaching artist, strengthening emotional literacy and fostering positive relationships through theatre & drama with hundreds of students. Gavin Rhys (Josh) The Promotion marks Gavin's mainstage debut with MPAACT, but that is a bit misleading as he has spent the past few years working with MPAACT on several show during their development. During the 4 years that we developed the musical Red Summer, Gavin brought in his amazing vocal instrument to help us refine characters and the production songbook. Later, he also offered his

talents on an early incarnation of *The Book of Me*, by Leonard House - which just debuted here as our first offering in the 33rd season. Gavin's previous credits include, *The Singularity Play* (Jackalope) *Twelfth Night* and *King Lear* (Montana Shakespeare in the Parks) *The Heat Death of the Universe* (The Once and Future Festival) *Queen C* and *Reality Theatre* (Trapdoor).



Alexandria Crawford (*Lois*) is an actor, teaching artist, and arts activist. Originally from St. Petersburg, Florida, she's now based in Chicago. Alexandria's training includes a B.A. in Theatre Arts and English from Rollins College, and an M.F.A. in Acting from Northwestern Univ., where she was a member of the inaugural cohort.

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PRODUCTION



Lauren "LL" Lundy (*Director*) is a graduate of The Theatre School at DePaul Univ. This season marks her 11th with MPAACT. Ms. Lundy began this journey as an emergency fill-in for stage manager on our world premiere of Gloria Bond Clunie's *Quark*. That same season, LL was welcomed into MPAACT as a company member, along with playwright Joseph Giovannetti. Though they have collaborated before as director and actor with *In the Mirror*

Darkly, as well as the numerous productions that they have shared billing as designers - *The Promotion* marks their first full production together in the roles of director and writer.

LL's MPAACT directing credits include, Warm on the Coolin' Board (2024 revival), Ezekiel's Wheel, Spoken Word, Swamp Baby, Starting Over, and Blood Mural. She has also directed the MPAACT touring productions Starting Over and In the Mirror Darkly.

LL has also helmed *Half Life* (Broken Nose - Bechdel Fest), *One Direction* (Black Lives, Black Words), *The Rocky Horror Picture Show Live!* (Underscore), *The Seventh Night* (MPAACT Summer Jams) *Songs I Don't Know* (MPAACT Signature Series), *The Sacred Mother Tongue* (MPAACT Signature Series), a workshop of *The Promotion* (Steep), and a workshop of *Evolve -Transformations* (Red Door/Portland, OR).

During the pandemic LL expanded her work into audio media, where she helped launch MPAACT into the digital marketplace with POD-CAST PLAYS. She has had the joy of reimagining five of her signature shows for "the Audio Multiverse" - Warm on the Coolin' Board, In the Mirror Darkly, Spoken Word, Swamp Baby and Starting Over.

In addition to her credits as a director, LL continues her invaluable work as MPAACT's Managing Producer. ... To Joe, the cast, and extended MPAACT family—thank you for making yet another world with me. Childhood dreams do come true.



Joseph Giovannetti (*Playwright*) is entering his second decade as an MPAACT company member. His work with the company has included acting, lighting design, and various production assignments. Currently, Joseph is a playwright and screenwriter based in Milwaukee, WI. His plays have been developed by the Kennedy Center, Steep Theatre in Chicago, IL, and New Jersey Reperatory Thea-

In addition to his work as a dramatist, Joe is also a regular contributor of Listen magazine, where he chronicles the history of the company and the artists who contribute to our vibrant work. Joe thanks his family for the support and inspiration to continue his craft. He also thanks LL, the cast and the production team for helping him fully actualize The Promotion.



Shepsu Aakhu (Tech Director) has been the T.D. with MPAACT for more than three decades. His most recent work includes, The Book of Me, Warm on the Coolin' Board (2024 revival), Tad in 5th City, Blackademics (2023 revival) Dandelions, Ezekiel's Wheel, Ride or Die, Pulled Punches, Spoken Word, One 4 the Road, and Swamp Baby. His favorite designs for MPAACT include Never

the Milk and Honey, Swamp Baby, Tad in 5th City, Beneath A Dark Sky (2008 revival), and Kosi Dasa, MiLK (2008 revival), and Notes from the Bottletree.

Lauren Wells-Mann (Costume Design) is a proud company member with MPAACT. In addition to her work as an award winning director, actor, and teaching artist, Lauren finds the time to put on her "costume designer hat" and help her company bring another show to life.
